School Social Work Updates

Hi y'all! I, Mrs. Marsh, am thrilled to be here at Grant with you once again. This will be my 5th year at Grant Elementary, and I am looking forward to working with all our truly amazing students.

During the recent legislative session, Utah lawmakers defined school counseling as; "a method used by School Counselors, School Social Workers, and School Psychologists to assist individuals and groups in learning how to solve problems, develop coping strategies and make decisions about personal health, social, emotional, behavioral, educational, vocational, financial, and other interpersonal concerns". In short, this means that I can support students by providing brief, solution focused support. However, I can help connect you/your family to additional services as needed. In addition to family resource support and individual student support, I also visit classrooms to teach Character Education (see more on page 4), run small groups, and help to facilitate our school wide processes.

Period Products in Bathrooms



We know that 4 out of5 girls have missed class, or know someone who has, due to lack of access to period products. Providing these products will allow them to learn, play, and thrive without worry. Parents or guardians are responsible for discussing the need for and proper use of period products with their children.

What is Bullying?

Each year, it is helpful to remind all of our school stakeholders - including students, families, and staff - what is and is not bullying. Students will be reviewing this with Mrs. Marsh during their September Character Education, but we wanted to make sure that everyone at home knows what we are talking about too!

What Bullying is:

- Harmful: Someone is hurt physically, socially, or emotionally.
- Unfair Match: The student or group of students does not have the physical, verbal, or social skills to effectively resist the bullying behavior.
- Repetition: The harm and unfair match are repeated over a period of time.

Bullying is an action of these three components. If you see or experience something that may be bullying, but you aren't sure, please don't hesitate to reach out!

What Bullying is not: Sometimes students are unkind, rude, or mean. One event of an unkind action is not bullying. However, if the action is harmful, involves an unfair match, and happens multiple times, then it is considered bullying.

Grant Elementary strives to be a place where all students feel safe and welcome. We have specific actions that we take when bullying is reported. If you see or experience bullying, please report it to a classroom teacher, Mrs. Marsh, Mrs. Preece, or Mrs. Burnside!

Character Education

This year's Character Education will take several forms - all of which are going to be fantastic for students and staff alike! Like all elementary schools in Murray City School District, we will be using the Second Steps curriculum again in all classrooms. As families, you can review the program content via the Murray Schools Teaching and Learning website linked here. You will find grades K-5 home links, family letters, and the scope and sequence. As an overview, Second Step teaches skills in four main areas; Skills for Learning, Empathy, Emotion Management, and Problem Solving. Visit the family letters for more details, or reach out to Mrs. Marsh with For 6th Grade students, topics questions! include Mindsets and Goals; Recognizing Bullying and Harassment; Thoughts, Emotions, and Decisions; as well as Managing Relationships and Social Conflict. In addition to weekly Second Step lessons taught by the classroom teacher, Mrs. Marsh will also be visiting the classrooms monthly for additional Character Education. This year, we will be using the MindUP curriculum. MindUP is an evidence based program that "fosters social and emotional awareness, enhances psychological well-being, and promotes academic success". Students will learn all about the brain, practice mindful strategies that help their brain focus and learn, as well as participate in community building projects.
